What is Life Change Seminar?

Life Change Seminar (LCS) is a positive peer culture (PPC) program that encourages new thinking, creative expression and commitment to personal growth in those whose lives have been impacted by crime and punishment.

THE MISSION: The mission of LCS is to guide and promote the (re)habilitation of participants by helping them organize, manage and assess the risks and responsibilities of life.

THE VISION: LCS transforms prison culture and the captive mindset by:

- Introducing PPC and Restorative Justice practices
- Promoting education and creative expression
- Focusing on discovering, pursuing and fulfilling purpose in life

How will the LCS Mission and Vision be accomplished?

LCS is developing a network of individuals and organizations to train and support those in prisons and on parole who have committed to personal life change and the good of the community.

There are 3 dimensions to LCS: Project Development, REAL Community and Core Study Group.

Dimensions of Life Change Seminar



Project Development

(new thinking)

Peers are given opportunities to explore resources and materials pertaining to Life-skills, Leadership and Mentorship through guest presentations from community leaders:

- ♦ **LIFE-SKILLS:** introducing the priority ladder of Faith, Family, Future, Finances and Friends will help people structure their morals and values.
- LEADERSHIP: An emphasis is placed on understanding the necessity of society's standards, how leaders are those who ensure the safety and success of the community by upholding its standards.
- MENTORSHIP: Positive role models will prepare candidates to serve the community as a group and as peer-to-peer mentors.



REAL Community

(creative expression)

Workshops offer peers the tools to Recognize, Explore, Apply and Live (REAL) their dreams and goals.

- RECOGNIZE the needs of others in the community in relation to their own real life experience.
- EXPLORE various ways to meet the needs of others and develop a realistic plan of action.
- APPLY their plan of action by putting it to work in the community.
- LIVE their dreams and goals right where they are until it becomes a reality in their community.
